Dear Parents/Carers,

Knox Central Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Knox Central Primary School's parent payment arrangements for 2021. We make every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all parents.

PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS – Bpay or EFTPOS only

Payment is not required until **Wednesday 27th January, 2021**, however, payment before **Tuesday 15th December 2020** would be greatly appreciated.

Due to social distancing requirements, we will not be accepting cash payments this year. Payment may be made in one of the following ways:

- **EFTPOS** by completing the attached payment slip and returning it to your child's teacher
- **BPay** from the convenience of your home. Please return the attached reply slip with your BPay receipt number. If you require your family's BPAY Reference Number and the School's Biller Code please contact the school office.

BOOK PACK DISTRIBUTION:

Due to Covid 19 social distancing requirements, we will not be holding a Book Pack Collection Day this year. Instead, once payment is received for 2021 Parent Payments, book packs will be sent home with students. We are expecting the book packs to be delivered to the school in early December.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

Knox Central Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers the following:

- Instalment Agreements for Essential Items
- Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) – A parent or guardian of a child under 16 who receives a Centrelink benefit and a Health Care Card or Pension Card, may be entitled to CSEF assistance (\$125 per child per year paid directly to the school)
- State Schools Relief Committee support.
- Pre-loved Uniform Shop

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PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

The following is a summary of the main principles of the Parent Payments Policy:



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements as outlined in the Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

- Schools do not ask parents to pay for school operating costs (e.g. utility costs) or general and unspecified charges.
- Schools request payments from parents under three categories:

Essential Student Learning Items

- Items and activities which the school deems essential for student learning.
- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

Optional Items

- Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a user-pays basis.

Voluntary Contributions

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and upload their arrangements on their school's public website for transparency.
